Camera systems will be used as part of driver education process for students

Belfield, North Dakota – Bob's Oilfield Service has made a donation to the North Dakota Driver and Traffic Safety Education Association for the purchase of DVR in-car camera and monitor to be used as part of driver's education training classes in Belfield Public School.

The in-car camera system is used to record teen driving experiences. The videos are then used in the classroom for activities such as simulated driving situations, situational awareness, movies, discussion and role-playing.
